

Do you want to take a stand against transgender medicalization of minors?

Here's how you can identify which providers in your state may partner with WPATH to enable minors to undergo harmful and irreversible gender related medicalization:

1.

Use the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH) database to see which providers in your area are considered partners with WPATH. You can access the database at www.wpath.org/provider/search

2.

Make a list of WPATH's locally recommended providers

Call the office of your state Attorney General and ask them to investigate medical practices and procedures related to minors and ensure they meet state legal limitations.

Call your Attorney's General office. Here is an example of what you can say:



“Hi, my name is ___ and I am calling from _(town or county)_. I read a recent New York Times article that outlined how the Biden Administration lobbied the World Professional Association for Transgender Health, or WPATH, to remove proposed age limits related to the transgender medicalization of minors. This makes me concerned that WPATH's partner providers in our state who are listed as _(local providers)_ might be pushing harmful transgender medical treatments on children, and might not be in keeping with state law.”
