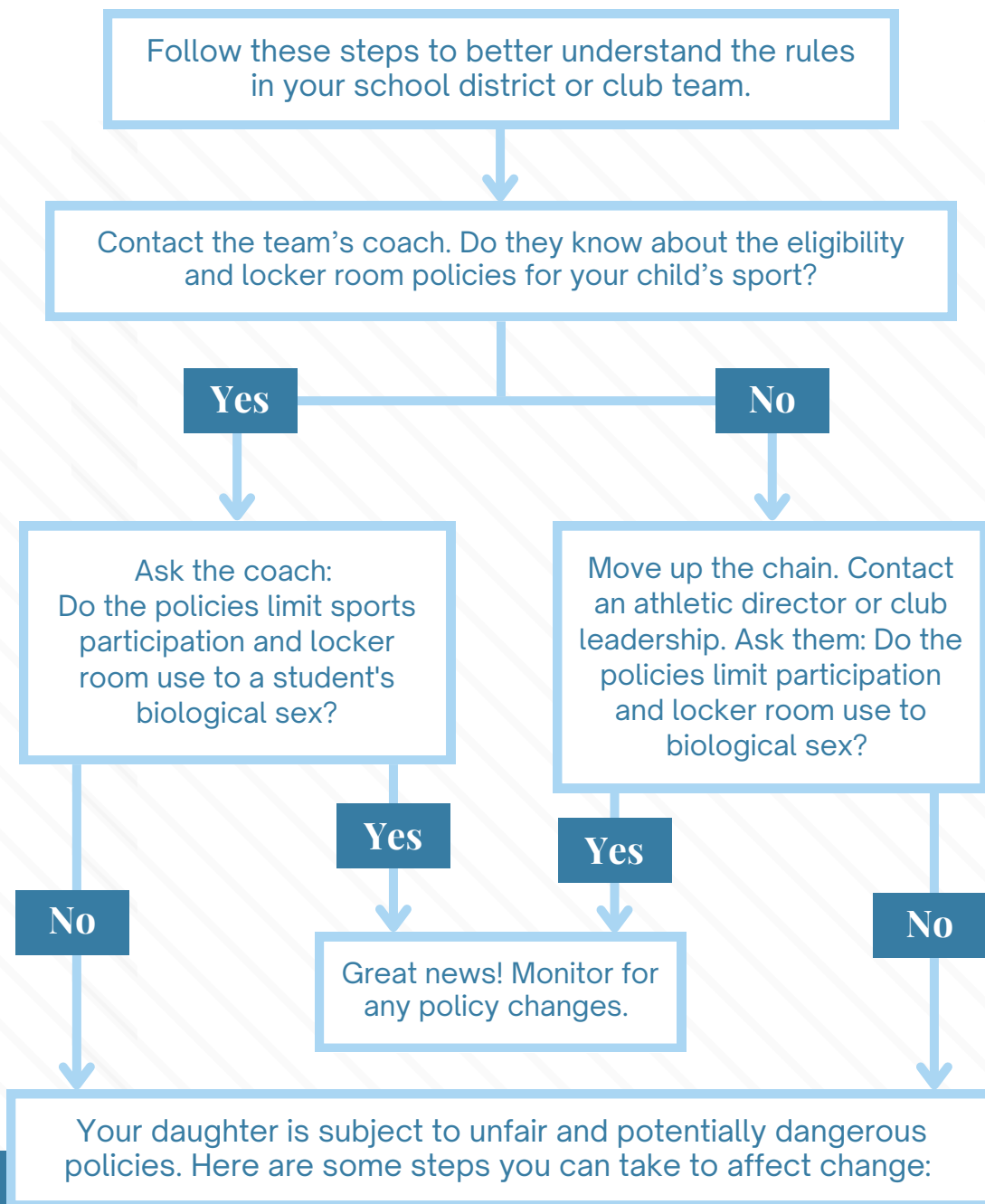


# What Do Changes to Title IX Mean for Your Daughter?



1. Write letters and make phone calls to make your concerns known. Consider reaching out to: School leadership, the school board, and state and local representatives. If this is a club team consider club leadership, boosters, and the state or national governing body ([Sample letter to State Representative/Senator](#); [Sample letter to School Board](#); [Talking Points on Title IX](#)).
2. Band together with other parents. The parents of other teammates may not be aware of the policy – organize a group of parents who share your concerns and reapproach leadership. Consider leaving the team or having the girls withhold their participation in protest.
